

#### My Faith and My Role in the Community

Steve and Alison Minton have lived in Tonbridge for 20 years, and are leading members of St. Philip's, one of the four churches in our Parish.

#### Tell us a little about yourselves

We've been happily married for 22 years, and have lived in Tonbridge for 20 years. We have two lovely daughters – Lucy, who is 18 and in her first year at university (studying Theology), and Hannah who is 16 and is just finishing her GCSE's. We usually attend St Philip's church. Steve works for Natwest Markets as an IT Manager, and Alison is the Academic Registrar for St Augustine's College of Theology based in West Malling.



#### How did your Christian faith develop?

Both of us went to Church as children and teenagers. Steve sang in his Church choir and Alison was very involved in her Church youth group. We drifted away from the Church during our twenties, although we had enough residual faith still keen to be married in church. That was in March 2000 (at All Saints, Crowborough). Once the children arrived Alison felt a strong calling to return to church and started attending St Philip's. Following an Alpha course and having joined a home group, she regained active faith shortly afterwards. A couple of years after that Stephen attended the Christianity Explored course, being run in the parish at that time. He was fortunate to end up in a home group with Gary Townsend and Peter Goodridge (as well as Jeremy and Patricia King), which brought him back to faith too.

### What involvement do you have with the church community and with the wider community?

As I am sure most in the parish are aware, we are involved in the sung worship, particularly at St Philip's. However, thanks to the pandemic we became much more involved with parish-wide worship. At the start of the first lockdown we were broadcasting live from our lounge, and continued to do this until we were able to return to our church buildings. It was a real privilege to lead sung worship from our front room, to provide an opportunity to raise our voices in praise together despite being physically separated from each other. In addition, Alison is part of the St Philip's leadership team as well as being a member of the PCC. She also attends the book club on a Monday morning. Steve is the leader of the 'cello section of the Tonbridge Philharmonic Society as well as their Digital officer. Steve can also sometimes be found at PlanetJJs, the board game café in Tonbridge, learning how to play a new board game. We're both involved in a home group too.

#### How do you like to relax?

What with church, orchestra, work and family life there isn't a huge amount of time to relax! We enjoy playing board games as a family and listening to music. We both read a lot although our tastes are very different. Alison prefers a crime novel whereas Steve is more often reading Science Fiction or Popular Science.



#### **Community News**

Numerous homes around Tonbridge have been opened to those who have fled Ukraine in recent months. Every family's experience has been different, and here is the beginning of the story from one host, whose visitors arrived in the middle of May.



We had been communicating on WhatsApp for three weeks before I sat and waited outside the arrivals gate of the Eurostar at St Pancras International to meet them for the first time. I knew they would be exhausted. They had travelled by train from Krakow with four changes, one in the early hours of the morning. Suddenly there they were, each with a

suitcase, a rucksack and a bag, looking lost and anxious. They didn't recognise me at first. I stood directly in front of the mother, looked her in the eyes as she spoke frantically into her phone and pointed at me. "I am Doreen" (1) I said and then repeated it again. Slowly recognition: "You are Doreen," and the relief spread across her face. "You are Doreen" she repeated, and I nodded. She then spoke into her phone with a more relaxed voice, and I heard the word "Doreen" repeated in amongst the garbled Ukrainian.

It wasn't until we reached the underground gates that the enormity of the situation hit me. I explained who they were, they showed their passports open at the visa stamp, staff smiled and gates opened, again at the other end, and at Charing Cross. We were ushered on to the train under the protection of the guard. I had a ticket; they did not. I lived here; they were refugees. There must be a war on I thought, and tears welled up. I had to stop the emotion quickly. They were being brave: I had to be in control too. The family have been here a month, absolutely determined to make their exodus work. Mum has been working full time for two weeks now, packing food, dealing with unpleasant smells and heavy loads; a 45-hour week with a 40-minute walk either end. In her home country she is a translator for an international insurance company. She still has her job; she is on furlough. The two girls were able to start school the week they arrived.

At home they hoover, wash up, clear their things away. They get food from the community larder. Nothing



is wasted, every left-over eaten the next day. They got clothes, shoes, bags and sanitary products from the Ukraine Relief Centre in Tunbridge Wells. Never a complaint. Tears well up during down time, or when a bomb went off behind their apartment block back home, where Dad and Maxy the dog and Diana the cat are. They video call Dad regularly.

Endless form filling, another 3-week wait for a bank account, a trip to Croydon to take their fingerprints and photograph, another form for a National Insurance number, always being nice, never assuming, always grateful.

What do they ask for? A chance to live like everyone else, to be accepted and respected. I have discovered their weakness for Nutella. I bought them each a big pot today and wrote their names on the lids in indelible ink. It is eaten with a spoon and a smile. It made me think of Christopher Robin and Pooh.



# Hyear of Subilee

The year 2022 marks the Platinum Jubilee for Her Majesty the Queen, a celebration of an extraordinary 70 years of service to the nation. As we have taken time to celebrate this very special anniversary let us acknowledge the importance of the Queen's faith in supporting and inspiring her throughout her remarkable reign. The Queen's Christian faith is well-known and it is clear that it has played a central role in her lifetime of service from the beginning. In her first Christmas broadcast in 1952 the Queen requested the people of the Commonwealth to pray for her as she prepared to dedicate herself to their service in her Coronation vows. More recently, in her 2014 Christmas broadcast, she described Jesus as 'an anchor in my life'.

The concept of Jubilee has a very special meaning in the Bible. The Jubilee Year is linked to the concept of sabbath – regular Holy times ordained by God "the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy" (Exodus 20:11). Every 50th year, counting from Israel's entry into the Promised Land, a special Jubilee or "liberty" year was to be proclaimed on the annual feast day known as the Day of Atonement. This was to be an entire year of festival, a time of restoration and renewed recognition of our complete dependence upon God.

Three strands of restoration were specified for the Jubilee celebration: restoration of personal liberty, restitution of property, and a return to a more simple life, trusting in God's provision. Ancestral lands that had been sold were to be returned and any who, compelled by poverty, had sold themselves as slaves, were to be given their liberty (Leviticus 25:10). The land itself was also to be allowed respite. There should be neither sowing nor reaping, the community was expected to live on what the fields and the vineyards produced "of themselves," and no attempt should be made to store up the products of the land (Leviticus 25:11). All this should be done in recognition that all ultimately belongs to God.

Jesus marked the start of his public ministry by quoting a section of Scripture related to the Jubilee. Quoting from Isaiah 61:1-2 he proclaimed, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." (Luke 4:18 - 19). The spirit of Jubilee is challenging but also joyful and transformative.

I will leave you with a quote from the Queen's Christmas 2002 broadcast: "I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and tough times. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right; to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God. I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."



#### Finances in an Uncertain World

There has been much media attention on our rising inflation, and we are all well aware of things starting to cost more. We look at how we can cope better with the rising cost of living, and then consider how we might invest for positive social and sustainable impact. Cost of living crisis: three tips to keep your finances under control. According to the ONS (Office for National Statistics), more than 75% of adults in the UK have seen their cost of living increase over the past month. It's more important than ever to take steps to get your personal finances in order.

<u>Keep control of your spending:</u> As Mr. Micawber famously said in David Copperfield, Charles Dickens' novel:

"Annual income £20, annual expenditure £19-19s-6d, result happiness.

Annual income £20, annual expenditure £20- 0s -6d, result misery."

Budgeting is a simple tool you can use to manage your finances as it allows you to track your spending and allocate your income to your expenses. Make sure you include everything in your budget and remember to re-calculate it regularly to reflect any changes.

Have a contingency plan: If you are able to do so, it is wise to build up an emergency pot of cash that you can fall back on should you face any unexpected costs. If you can manage it, try to hold several month's expenditure in cash deposits for use in case of need.

Shop around for the best deals: Start with the big items, such as ensuring you're on a competitive mortgage rate, which can save you hundreds of pounds each month. Once you've tackled this, look at things that have crept up in price, such as broadband, TV subs, insurances, or your gym. Shop around for the best deals. #### Investing for positive social and sustainable impact

Many people now want to use their money to make a difference in society and the environment. It can go by many names, but whether it's termed green, ethical, ESG (environmental, social & governance) or sustainable investing, the aim is generally the same – to run a profitable business while making the world a better place. It's clear this is a fast-growing market.

Ethical investing used to focus on excluding specific companies and sectors – like tobacco or arms. Today though, most strategies have evolved to include companies that have best in class ESG scores in a particular sector. Impact investing goes a step further by investing in companies whose products and services generate social and environmental impact as well as financial returns. Tackling global climate change is becoming increasingly important, and low emissions businesses will be better prepared for climate change transition risk. But no investment is included based on its environmental or social credentials alone – it must also aim to deliver an attractive return for investors. Demand is being driven by

this combination and an increasing number of people who prefer to invest in line with their personal values. There are now quite a few companies offering the option of investing in this way.
